Is It Summer Yet?

Last year, we hosted 2 Summer Rising camps in partnership with the NYC Department of Youth & Community Development. These camps were staffed by counselors from Maspeth Town Hall and the Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP).

After-School Program Update

We have had a terrific beginning to the new year in our after-school programs, which we host at 13 schools across Maspeth, Middle Village, Glendale, Ridgewood, Corona, Elmhurst, and Woodside. Our students have been enjoying enhanced offerings and new programs.

Along with homework help, we offer many academic enrichment programs during the school year including Chess, Book Club, Lego Education, Creative Writing, and OSMO (an educational and interactive learning tool that utilizes digital and physical tangible components focused on curriculum-based learning). Students can enjoy the new yoga, sign language, drama, and cooking options, as well as the popular dance, computer coding, photography, music, and fine art clubs. Our physical fitness activities include sports leagues (volleyball, soccer, basketball, flag football, and European handball) and recreational games. All of the programs we offer help enhance problem solving skills, improve social interactions, reduce stress, develop positive self-esteem, and give kids an opportunity to just have fun in a safe environment.

Last fall, we hosted 2 special events. The High School 101 Virtual Panel featured current high school students who shared advice and tips with our junior high students. This high school preparedness webinar focused on the application process and transitioning out of junior high, and the panelists shared some of their experiences in high school. Career Day, which was hosted for our elementary school students, showcased unique career paths including graphic design and cosmetology, presented by some of our staff members. We hope to continue to offer these sessions in the future.

7 of our after-school programs are generously funded through grants from the New York City Department of Youth and Community Development (DYCD). We also receive grants from the New York State Office of Children and Family Services, ExpandEd, and Maspeth Federal Savings Bank. Throughout the year, we receive regular visits from these entities, and all the sites are inspected by the New York City Department of Health. We are pleased to report that we are in complete compliance and have received high marks from all these assessments.

A lot of hard work goes into running these after-school programs. We are fortunate to have an amazing group of site directors, counselors, team leaders, and various educational and recreational specialists who are dedicated to providing the most enriching setting for our students.
